

"CANNES FOR KIDS" CELEBRATES CLOSING NIGHT Kidsfest Kudos to Award Winning Filmmakers!

Chicago, IL November 3 - FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

This year, the 25th Annual Chicago International Children's Film Festival congratulates the winners of more than 30 awards presented at the CICFF's American Airlines Closing Nights Awards Presentation on Sunday, November 2, 2008 at Columbia College's Film Row Cinema. Jimmy Tsai, star of Ping Pong Playa was the first to congratulate these winners as host of the evening's celebration. Over 100 international filmmakers came to watch the most acclaimed films of the festival, eager to hear the responses of the 26,000 children who participated in this year's event.



Chicago audiences casting their votes for their favorite flicks this year awarded the **Best of the Fest** award to Ingelore König for Stella and the Star of the Orient (Germany, 2007), an adventure in which a young girl travels back in time to learn that family is forever. "This is absolutely thrilling for us. Winning a prize from the children's jury was already wonderful, but winning the Best of Fest prize will make an extraordinary difference in bringing the film to audiences worldwide," said Ms. König.

Best of the Fest Winner 2008: Stella and the Star of the Orient

As always, the room fell silent as the audience held their breath to hear the winners of the prizes which would qualify live-action and animated short films for Academy Award consideration. The winner of the Adult Jury Live-Action Short Film or Video category was David Cooke for The Morse Collectors (UK, 2008), a sensitive and suspenseful film set in Ireland where two siblings receive messages from the spirits of children lost in the Holocaust.

Winner of the Adult Jury Animated Short Film went to Hsin-I Tseng for her unique and delightful stop-action and cut-out animated short, Dear Fatty (USA, 2008), the tale of a traveling hamster

told through the voice and letters of a child who misses her pet. The Adult Jury Live-Action Feature Film or Video went to Bernd Neuburger for *Mozart in China* (Austria, 2007). where loyalty is tested, respect is earned, and shadow puppets are brought to life in an enchanting story that seamlessly brings together Chinese and Austrian culture and music.

Anne Halsey, Director of the Poetry Foundation's Media Program, announced the CICFF's **Poetry Foundation Award** winner, for which the recipient received a \$10,000 cast prize to the film that truly reflects the spirit of poetry in film for young audiences. This year's winners were filmmaker Alyssa Sherwood and Poet, Dorian Merina for *Migrations* (USA, 2007). "I treasure this moment and this award more than I can say. It's a tremendous honor for Dorian Merina and myself and I am deeply touched," said Ms. Sherwood accepting her award. The CICFF also announced the Poetry Foundation's continued support for this unique prize in 2009.



Other prominent festival winners and awards include: The Kenneth and Harle Montgomery Prize of \$2,500 for Best Film or Video by an Emerging Director, awarded to Cayman Grant for her short live-action film, *His Good Will* (Canada/USA 2008); the Kenneth and Harle Montgomery Prize of \$2,500 for Best Child-Produced Film or Video was given to Molly Nemer, TVbyGirls for *New Orleans* (USA, 2007).
