# Chicago International Children's Film Festival Announces Press Subheading

Chicago, Illinois Jan 24, 2007 Yesterday's announcement of the 2007 Oscar nominees brought news that three CICFF prize winners and jury favorites are up for prizes at the 79th Academy Awards.

"The Chicago International Children's Film Festival is the only Academy-nominating children's festival in the world, and having three of our prize winners and official selections compete for the Oscars this year sends an important message. We're raising the bar for quality children's programs," says CICFF Program Director Deidre Searcy.

The three CICFF films nominated for Oscar consideration are:

THE DANISH POET (Canada/Norway, 2006, 15 min) Renowned Norwegian actress and director Liv Ullmann narrates this 2006 CICFF Official Selection about an uninspired but persistent poet. The film is both humorous and tender, featuring an animation style that combines The Triplets of Belleville with Dilbert. Nominated for **Best Animated Short** Film, this is the second Oscar nod for director



Torill Kove, whose *My Grandmother Ironed the King's Shirts* also went from CICFF acclaim to Oscar contention.

The Little Matchgirl tells of a poor little girl who's forced to light the matches she sells in order to keep warm. The film was the last Disney animated project to utilize a now outdated digital ink and paint program, which gives the picture's warm and cold color scheme a tangibility the audience can really feel. Directed by Roger Allers (*The Lion King*), this 2006 CICFF Festival Favorite joins *The Danish Poet* in the running for the Best Animated Short Film Oscar.

BINTA AND THE GREAT IDEA (Spain, 2004, 30 min) At the 2004 CICFF, Javier Fesser took home the prestigious Montgomery Prize for Best Film by an Emerging Director for this spirited short film. Mixing gorgeous visuals, lively music, and wonderful performances, Binta and the Great Idea follows a young girl in Senegal who tries to help her father make the world a better place. This year, the Academy recognizes Fesser's picture in the Best Live Action Short Film category.
